

# Supporting Families at New Hope Church

## 1. THE CHALLENGE

At New Hope Church, Pastor Martin saw families struggling under the weight of aging, caregiving, and uncertainty. The Thompsons — grandparents, their adult children, and teenage grandchildren — all attended the church. When the grandfather was suddenly hospitalized, stress and division quickly surfaced.

- Who had the authority to speak for him?
- How would medical and financial decisions be handled?
